"rough" beaches with the most recent Maui lava flows (between 1480 and 1600) on the southern tip of Maui closest to the Big Island actually called Hawaii, which is also the location of the most recent volcanic activity. Both videos end with the connection to this trip, WE (Mike and I) on a ride and then of course Lani Lani.

The last two videos from this trip to Maui provides the obligatory "true" beach visits. Both are presented here as 360 videos such that you are not stuck with one view. Use the



YouTube controls to turn the view to that which you wish. The first being a noon-time view of the average Maui beach "presence". The last video

is the required Sunset from directly across the street from our Condo. Again, using the 360 view controls you can see that street

entrance as well as the 10-minute sunset.
